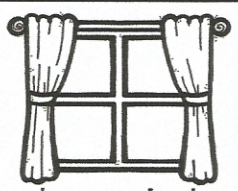

Window

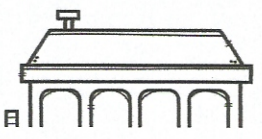
