<p><b>Language Arts</b> (Mrs. Adamson)</p>	<p>This month's language arts theme is <b>Mythology</b>. Students will begin this week by writing a journal using a teacher provided prompt to guide them. They will be working on Grammar, reading comprehension and correct the Sentence. Students will continue to work through their Ontario Reading books. We will continue our class read aloud novel, <u>The Twits</u> by Roald Dahl. We will begin reading chapter 2 of our in class novel, <u>Zeus and the Thunderbolt of Doom</u>. This week, we will continue working on our cursive writing. We will continue talking about the setting of a story as well as fiction vs. non-fiction books.</p>
<p><b>Math</b> (Mrs. Adamson)</p>	<p>Students will be working on the Saxon Math program lessons 14-18. In these lessons we will be looking at dividing shapes into equal parts, reading thermometers and rounding to the nearest 10. We will continue to work on prodigy during our math lab on Thursday. There will be a math test consolidating knowledge from lesson 11-14 on Tuesday September 25th.</p>
<p><b>Science</b> (Mrs. Adamson)</p>	<p>Students will continue to work on the unit 'Forces and Movement.' We will be taking a closer look at magnets, including the earth acting as a magnet. We will begin a small research project on magnets with questions the class has created. Each student will be presenting their research findings to their peers.</p>
<p><b>Social Studies</b> (Mrs. Adamson)</p>	<p>Students will be introduced to their first topic of the term 'Communities in Canada 1780-1850.' We will be looking at Aborigines and the groups within them. We will take a closer look at how this group of people lived.</p>
<p><b>French</b> (Ms. Israil)</p>	

<b>Music</b> <b>(Mr. Kudera)</b>	The students will review the lines and spaces of the treble clef, and time values for the following notes: quarter, half, dotted half, and whole. Students are reminded to bring their recorder to EVERY music class. This week, students are to practice the exercises on page 3 of <a href="#">Recorder Karate</a> . They will also continue to practice the song <a href="#">Count On Me</a> for the upcoming Grandparents' Day assembly.
<b>Media Arts</b> <b>(Mrs. Grovum)</b>	Our theme this week in Media Arts is Family & Grandparents. Students will explore family in literature with read-alouds and book related activities.
<b>Visual Art</b> <b>(Ms. James)</b>	Last week students brainstormed ideas for our independent <b>Pop</b> Art Projects. This week we will focus on practicing the technique of the artist and begin our final projects.
<b>Computers</b> <b>(Mr. Kudera)</b>	Students will practice their keyboarding skills using typingclub.com.
<b>Drama</b> <b>(Mrs. Massaro)</b>	Students will be working on reader's theatre pieces.
<b>Physical Education</b> <b>(Coach Fretz)</b>	Students will be taking part in soccer skills this week. They will also be training for cross country and taking part in various cooperative games. Each Friday students will take part in active and cooperative games to earn points for their House (Torrin, Malliag, Kyleakin).
