<p><b>Language Arts</b> (Mrs. Adamson)</p>	<p>This month's language arts theme is <b>Mythology</b>. Students will begin this week by writing a journal using a teacher provided prompt to guide them. They will be working on Grammar, reading comprehension and correct the Sentence. Students will continue to work through their Ontario Reading books. We will continue our class read aloud novel, <u>The Twits</u> by Roald Dahl. We will begin reading chapter 3 of our in class novel, <u>Zeus and the Thunderbolt of Doom</u>. We will be continuing with our cursive letters this week. New spelling words will be sent home weekly every Monday.</p>
<p><b>Math</b> (Mrs. Adamson)</p>	<p>Students will be working on the Saxon Math program lessons 19-23. In these lessons we will be looking at rounding numbers to the nearest ten, fact families, dividing shapes into equal parts, regrouping and money. We will continue to work on prodigy during our math lab on Thursday. There will be a math test consolidating knowledge from lesson 15-20 on Wednesday October 3rd.</p>
<p><b>Science</b> (Mrs. Adamson)</p>	<p>Students will continue to work on the unit 'Forces and Movement.' We will be presenting our Magnet Research projects to the class and evaluating through peer assessment. We will be taking a look at static electricity and conducting some fun experiments in class.</p>
<p><b>Social Studies</b> (Mrs. Adamson)</p>	<p>Students will be introduced to their first topic of the term 'Communities in Canada 1780-1850.' We will be looking at at the Six First Nations groups as well as the Wendat Group.</p>
<p><b>French</b> (Ms. Israil)</p>	<p>This week students continue learning and reviewing "la rentree" vocabulary and review "ER" verbs. Grade 3s have a spelling test on Thursday , October 5. ( please see students binders).</p>

<b>Music</b> <b>(Mr. Kudera)</b>	The students will continue to practice playing their recorder. This week they will focus on articulation techniques.
<b>Media Arts</b> <b>(Mrs. Grovum)</b>	Our theme this week is Thankfulness. Students will explore topics of thankfulness and Thanksgiving and complete an upcycled book craft!
<b>Visual Art</b> <b>(Ms. James)</b>	Last week students were hard at work, practicing the specific techniques of various artists. This week they will begin working on their final projects for Pop Art! Each class will focus on a different artist/technique for their final projects.
<b>Computers</b> <b>(Mr. Kudera)</b>	The students will review basic computer literacy. They will also practice their keyboarding skills using typingclub.com.
<b>Drama</b> <b>(Mrs. Massaro)</b>	Students will be practising their reader's theatre pieces.
<b>Physical Education</b> <b>(Coach Fretz)</b>	Students will be taking part in soccer skills this week. They will also be training for cross country and taking part in various cooperative games. Each Friday students will take part in active and cooperative games to earn points for their House (Torrin, Malliag, Kyleakin).
<b>Health</b> <b>(Mr. Fretz)</b>	Students will continue their first unit on Healthy Eating this week. They will review the "Super Heroes" from last week and identify the "Super Snacks" the heroes had. Students will share their superhero to the class and learn about different types of nutrients found in food.
