<p>Language (Mrs. Patterson)</p>	<p>Students will continue their work on essay writing in various formats and genres.</p> <p>This week, students will have their spelling test on List #11 words: escort, ornamental, ordinary, mourn, courtyard, concourse, hoarse, uproar, quarrel, quarantine. The next spelling list #12 words are: shipment, shipper, flatly, flatten, admit, admittance, omit, omitting, expel, expelled. The test for List #12 will be on May 9th.</p> <p>Grammar: This week in Grammar, students will move onto the "Know Capitalization and Punctuation" section of the workbook. Students will also be working on their Impressionist biographies and paintings.</p>
<p>Social Studies (Mr. Rodayan)</p>	<p>Students will focus on researching news stories relating to Canada's role & influence internationally. They will work on strategies for sorting through an abundance of information in their search for reliable resources and they will be shown how to create a bibliography using both web and library-based resources.</p>
<p>Science (Mr. Rodayan)</p>	<p>Students will be working on information related to their science unit: biodiversity.</p>
