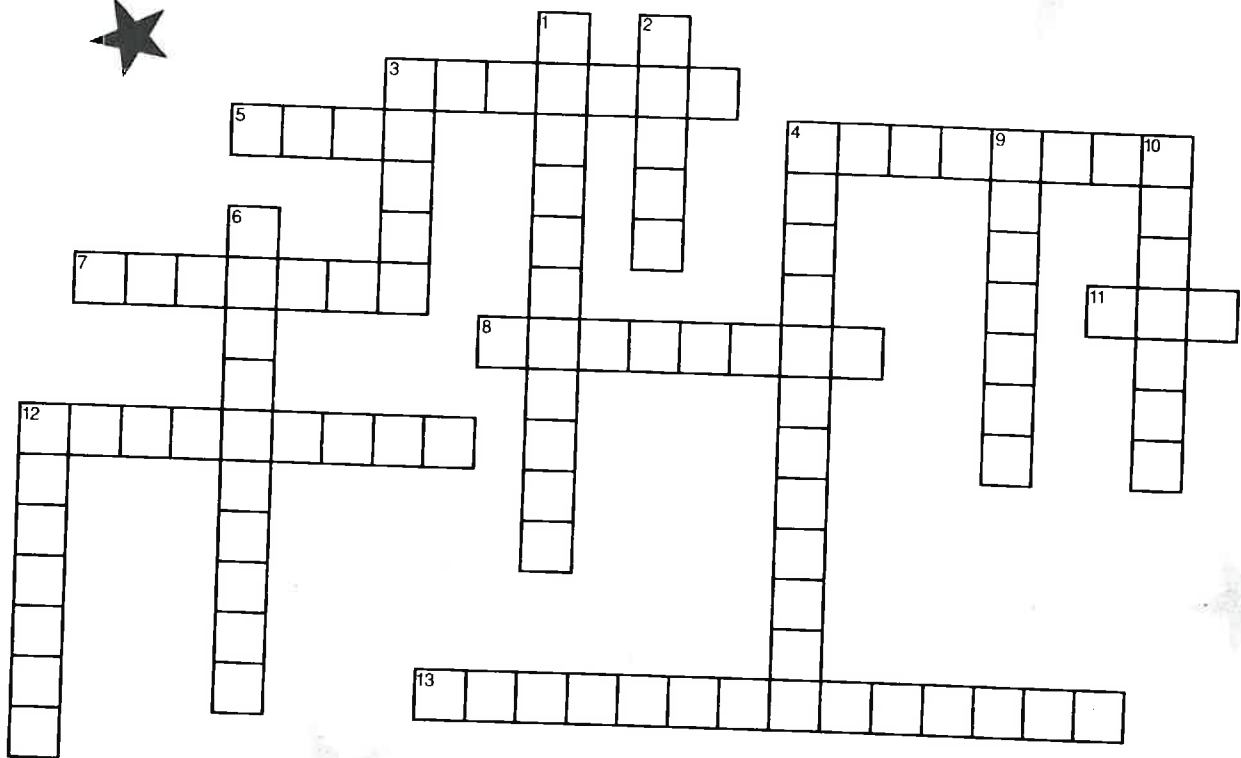

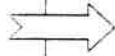

- The branch of government that makes laws; this branch is known as the Congress.
