What is apportionment?	Apportionment is the dividing up of the 435 seats in the House of Representatives so that each representative has a district of about the same size. In other words, each of the 435 representatives in the House has an equal "portion" of the People to represent.
What is the definition of a committee?	A committee is a small group of people who meet for some reason. Legislative committees meet to discuss bills that are focused on the particular topic of each committee.
What is the difference between a federal law and a state law?	A federal law has to be followed by everyone in the USA, whereas a state law only applies to the people in that particular state.
What is the main purpose of the Legislative Branch?	The main purpose of the Legislative Branch is to make the laws for our country. This is done by the Congress.
What process is used for counting the population in the U.S. and how often is it done?	The census is done every 10 years in order to count the population of the U.S.

What title is given to the leader of the House of Representatives and how does s/he get that position of leadership?	The leader of the House is called the Speaker of the House. S/he is elected by the members of the House. The political party that has the majority of members in the House chooses one of the representatives in their own party to be the Speaker.
What title is given to the leader of the U.S. Senate and how does s/he get that position of leadership?	The leader of the Senate is called the Senate Majority Leader. S/he is elected by the members of the Senate. The political party that has the majority of members in the Senate chooses one of the senators in their own party to be the Majority Leader.
Why are the positions of Speaker of the House and Senate Majority Leader so important?	The leaders of each chamber have the power to decide which bills and other items of business will be considered for a vote and in what order that will happen. If the Speaker or Majority Leader decides not to act on a piece of legislation at all, that is just the way it is. They have a lot of power to control the laws that will or will not be made while they are the leaders.
