Legislative Branch (Makes the Laws)

Can check the <u>Executive Branch</u> in these ways:

- By refusing to pass a bill the President wants
- By overriding a veto and passing a law with a two-thirds majority
- By impeaching the President who may have done something wrong, in hopes of removing him/her from office
- By refusing to approve a Presidential appointment (Senate power only)
- By refusing to ratify (pass) a treaty the President has signed (Senate power only)

Can check the <u>Judicial Branch</u> in these ways:

- By impeaching a judge or justice for wrong doings, in hopes of removing him/her from the bench.
- Can amend the Constitution

Executive Branch (Carries out the Laws)

Can check the <u>Legislative Branch</u> in this way:

• By vetoing a bill Congress has passed

Can check the <u>Judicial Branch</u> in this way:

• By nominating federal court judges and Supreme Court justices

Judicial Branch (Interprets the Laws)

Can check the <u>Legislative Branch</u> in this way:

• By saying that a law is unconstitutional, and therefore not allowed

Can check the <u>Executive</u> <u>Branch</u> in this way:

• By declaring (saying) that actions by the President, or others in the Executive Branch, are unconstitutional and must be stopped
