1. "The Star-Spangled Banner" is a narrative poem since the poet desired to tell a story through verse. What is Francis Scott Key trying to communicate through the poem? To whom do you think he is trying to communicate? If you were trying to tell the story in prose, how would you communicate his intended message? As Francis Scott Key, compose a letter to a neighbor describing the events.	2. Research the War of 1812 and the Battle of Baltimore in 1814. What were the events the led up to the poem? What do you think followed the events of the poem? Write two additional verses, or paragraphs, to add at the beginning and end of the poem that describe the events before and after the poem.	3. Create a scrapbook (3 pages) that a mother of an American soldier at Fort McHenry would have put together.
4. Some politicians and scholars have tried to replace "The Star-Spangled Banner" as the national anthem due to the violent imagery and possible racist reference in the poem. Find the violent imagery in the poem and discuss whether the content of "The Star-Spangled Banner" is appropriate for the national anthem. What is your personal opinion of the anthem's verse and music? Do you think it is well-written poetry? Why or why not? What about the tune?
