The presentation should include all of the following:

- □ Ensure work and speaking is evenly divided amongst group members
- □ A PowerPoint or other media (enlarged pictures, video, etc.)
 Only relevant information is included → more pictures, fewer words!
- \Box Engage with the audience (eye contact, ask them questions, etc.)
- \Box Make sure you are well prepared, do not read off of your slides or notes
