





IMSE Decodable Readers: Set I Easy Print and Assemble Instructions

- 1. Use the Quick Links chart on the next page. Click on a title to go directly to that book. Note the page numbers for print.
- 2. Print pages single sided
- 3. Fold the cover page in half. Be sure to line up the corners
- 4. Fold all remaining pages in half, individually, with the folded side to the right.
- 5. Insert stacked pages into the folded cover making sure all pages are aligned properly.
- 6. Staple twice to the left of the dotted line.
- 7. Using the dotted line as a guide, place a strip of 1 inch tape along the left side to cover the staples.
