## What is it?

## How to Begin:

- \*Make sure to use a variety of materials
- \*You do NOT need to spend a lot of money on materials. Look around your house and classroom for items to use. See your teacher for butcher paper if needed.

## Floats will be graded on the following criteria:

Your float needs to include the following components:

State Capital	5pts
State Flag	5pts
State Nickname	5pts
State Motto/Seal	5pts
Statehood Date	5pts
State Map	5pts

4+ famous landmarks, attractions, events, or produc	ts 20pts
4+ symbols such as the state tree, flower, bird, etc	20pt <i>s</i>
Name of your state prominently displayed	5pts
Your name	5pts
Neatness and Pizzazz	up to 20 pts

<sup>\*\*</sup>Start early and do a little each week to make this project manageable. Start with a design, and do one part at a time. We will be working on a facts sheet and starting the flag and map in class during Social Studies.
