Scroll through the authors and illustrators listed (sorting my author last name may help you find someone specific!, choose an author or illustrator who is both familiar to you and someone you'd like to learn more about. Click on the author. On that author's page, there will be a "Meet-the-Author" link, click this link. Watch the interview!</p> <p>What did you learn about this author or illustrator?
