

El Pretérito

- “Simple” past tense – for things that have already happened
 - He *ran*, he *did run*.
- Conjugating el pretérito for regular verbs:
 - Start with infinitive
 - Find verb stem (*remove –ar, -er, -ir*)
 - Add endings for el pretérito:

-AR verb pretérito endings

-é	-amos
-aste	-asteis
--ó	-aron

-ER AND -IR verb pretérito endings

-í	-imos
-iste	-isteis
--ió	-ieron

El Pretérito (continued)

- **Most** regular verbs in the present tense are also regular in el pretérito.
- **Dar** and **Ver** use regular pretérito endings, but with no accents.
 - *Di, diste, dio, dimos, disteis, dieron*
 - *Vi, viste, vio, vimos, visteis, vieron*
- **Boot** verbs are regular in el pretérito – no stem change.

El Pretérito (continued)

- **Some** verbs have a spelling change at end of stem in el pretérito – for “yo” form only:
- **-car:** *c changes to qu*
 - (sacar) saqué
 - Other examples:
- **-zar:** *z changes to c*
 - (almorzar) almorcé
 - Other examples:
- **-gar:** *g changes to gu*
 - (jugar) jugué
