- All Students are required to complete a CTAE Pathway to Graduate. Must pass the End of Pathway Test to get a cord.
- EOC COURSES ARE MANDATORY TO GRADUATE

GRADES FOR COLLEGE CLASSES

- NOTE: Each student that obtains a passing grade of an "A", "B", or "C" while enrolled in a college level course will be awarded 10 extra points to their final grade.
- College grade of "A" = 95 . . . with +10 = 105 GPA grade
- College grade of "B" = 85... with +10 = 95 GPA grade
- College grade of "C" = $75 \dots$ with +10 = 85 GPA grade
- College grade of "D" = 70 ---- This will not earn the 10 additional points, however the student will earn a passing grade.

TEST

- ACCUPLACER Entrance Test for Junior Colleges and Technical Colleges. Watch for sign up to take the accuplacer at MHS or can be taken at the college.
- ACT or SAT Entrance exams for any college. Esp 4 year colleges or universities.
- ACT and SAT waivers are available to Juniors and Seniors – 1 each per year.
- ASVAB will be given September 17, 2019. <u>Sign up with</u>
 <u>Ms. Cook</u>. Test shows aptitude and is used to get into the Military.

SAT/ACT

- College Entrance Test Required for 4 year Universities.
- SAT given by college board measures reading, writing, and mathematics
- Scores 800 each part = maximum score possible 1600.
- ACT given by ACT.org measures reading, writing, and mathematics.
- Scores max of 36
- Additional information found at www.collegeboard.org and www.act.org
- Waivers available in the counselors office for 11th and 12th graders only.

PSAT – Preliminary SAT

- PSAT will be given to all 10th graders and interested 11th graders on Oct. 16, 2019.
- 11th graders sign up with Ms. Cook before September 18th.
- 11th Graders are eligible for the National Merit Scholarship.
- Measures Reading, Mathematics, and Writing.
- PSAT scores can also be used in place of the Accuplacer for Dual Enrollment.

HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

- Regular HOPE Scholarship Pays 80-90% of tuition only. Requires a 3.0 HOPE GPA
- Zell Miller Scholarship Pays 100% of tuition only. Requires a 3.7 HOPE GPA plus 1200 on SAT Reading and Math. Valedictorians and Salutatorians with a minimum 3.0 GPA receive the Zell Miller Scholarship
- Core areas only English, Math, Science, Social Studies, and Foreign Language.

- 7 Year cap on HOPE Scholarship after graduating from High School.

RIGOR CLASSES FOR HOPE

- 4 or More rigorous courses <u>required</u> to receive HOPE with a 3.0 GPA.
- Advanced Placement courses. Ex. AP U S History, Environmental Science.
- Dual Enrollment <u>core</u> courses at the college level
- Anatomy
- Alg. II
- Pre-Cal
- Chemistry
- Spanish II and III
- AMDM
- Forensic Science

Calculate your GPA

- **A** = 4 points
- \bullet B = 3 points
- **C** = 2 points
- **F** = **o points**
- Earn extra points by taking Dual Enrollment courses – 10 extra points added to your course GPA grade.

Your Transcript

- Divided into 4 parts for 9th,
 10th, 11, and 12th grade classes
- Cumulative GPA
- Rank based on highest GPA

- Sign up with NCAA during your 11th grade if interested in receiving a scholarship to a college/university based on athletics.
