

The earth's rotation curves winds to the right in the Northern Hemisphere, and to the left in the Southern Hemisphere. This shift in winds is known as the <u>Coriolis effect</u>. In addition, the winds which touch the surface of the earth are affected by the amount of land and/or ocean nearby, as well as mountains and other landforms. Air pressure and weather fronts also affect wind direction.
