#### **Instructions to Login to Jupiter**


**1.** Go to <u>https://login.jupitered.com/login/</u>.


**Objective:** The students will match letters to sounds.

- Mobile device (cellular phone, ipad, tablet, etc.)

### **Directions:**

- 1. Make two sets of alphabet cards. Give one adult and your child a set of alphabet cards provided within the document.
- Tell the adult that they will be playing Simon says using commands such as: "Simon says touch the letter F with your pinky."
- 3. Press record on your mobile device and start recording your child stating the following information:
  - a. My name is \_\_\_\_\_
  - b. I am going to play Simon Says with my \_\_\_\_\_.
  - c. We are going to match letters and sounds together.
- 4. Now, you will let the adult say the following commands below: Simon says:
