## SEPT: ALL ABOUT ME



This month's theme is 'All About Me'. During this month we will cover four main sub-topics:

- \*Self
- \*Friends
- \*Feelings
- \*Self-esteem

Each of these sub-topics will include appropriate themed stories, activities and worksheets that will intertwine the theme with curriculum goals.

I will introduce several curriculum subjects that will be covered within the theme, and separately, to assist the children in their ability to transfer previous knowledge to new situations. September will focus on the following concept areas within the subject content curriculum.

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## Language Arts:

Language Arts is a large curriculum area that covers several concepts. This month we will cover letters aA, iI, and oO along with their respective short vowel sounds. In addition to these letters we will look at and discover the high frequency words "a", "I", and "see" within our thematic stories. We will also practice printing our focus letters, HFW and our names, and identify simple sentence structure.

#### Math:

Number concepts for 1,2, and 3 will be our focus. Counting, writing and identifying these numbers through various activities to help expose the children to counting and 1-to-1 correspondence, in addition to recognizing the numerals and number words.

Utilizing thematic stories, we will work on identifying book parts, story elements, reading comprehension, and story elements such as characters, setting and plot.

Science: 'Our 5 Senses' will be the focus in science. Sight, smell, touch, hearing and taste will be the subjects of several different fun hands-on activities throughout the month.

Social Studies: Friendship---how to be a friend to others and how to work together to accomplish a goal.
