



What is the May Crowning?

During the month of May, Catholics from all around the world celebrate the Virgin Mary. In fact, the month of May is named for and dedicated to Mother Mary. It is common for Catholics to participate in a ritual called The Crowning of Mary, or May Crowning on May 1st.

The May Crowning is a celebration that is signified by a procession. A procession is when participants walk from one place to another during a liturgy. They carefully walk one after another, often from the back of a church to the front, or to the altar. During a procession, participants may pause to say special prayers depending on the celebration. They may also carry special objects, such as torches, banners, statues, or other types of offerings or gifts. The choir is also often involved in a procession.

During the Crowning of Mary, a statue of Mary is blessed and "crowned" with a garland or wreath of flowers. This honours Mother Mary the Queen of May. Many flowers are associated with Mother Mary, and often people plant "Mary gardens," which are small, special gardens that are planted around a statue of Mother Mary.

Luke 1:26 - 36: The Virgin Mary

During Elizabeth's sixth month of pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to a woman who lived in Nazareth, a town in Galilee. She was engaged to marry a man named Joseph from the family of David. Her name was Mary.

The angel came to her and said, "Greetings! The Lord has blessed you and is with you."

But Mary was very confused by what the angel said. Mary wondered, "What does this mean?"

The angel said to her, "Don't be afraid, Mary, because God is pleased with you. You will become pregnant. You will give birth to a son, and you will name him Jesus. 

After Mary is crowned, it is typical to recite prayers in Mary's honour, or to recite prayers to Mother Mary herself. A common prayer is the Hail Mary. Take some time to recite these prayers with your family members.

Hail Mary, full of grace.
The Lord is with thee.
Blessed art thou amongst

women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death, Amen.



Songs for May Crowning

You may also sing special songs that are dedicated to Mother Mary after her crowning. We call these songs Marian hymns.



Prayer Writing with ACTS

A.C.T.S is an acronym that describes four elements of prayer. It stands for Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving and Supplication

Adoration

We tell Mother Mary how special she is and how much we love her. We use words of praise to describe how wonderful Mary is,

Example: "Mother Mary you are so special and wonderful. You look over us and care for us."

Confession

We reflect on our sins and transgressions, and tell Mary and God how we $\stackrel{\bullet}{\bullet}$ have hurt them.

Example: "I apologize for not always being honest. I apologize for not showing kindness to those around me."

Prayer Writing with ACTS

Thanksgiving

We thank God, Mother Mary, or both, for all that was given to us and for their love. We express our gratitude for all that is good in our lives and in the world.

Example: "Thank you for providing us with a safe place to live. Thank you for friends and family. Thank you for sending your son Jesus Christ to die on the cross for us.

Supplication

We ask God and/or Mother Mary for something we want or need. We pray for our own needs and for the needs of others.

Example: "Please help those in the world who are suffering. Please provide my friends and family with happiness and good health."
