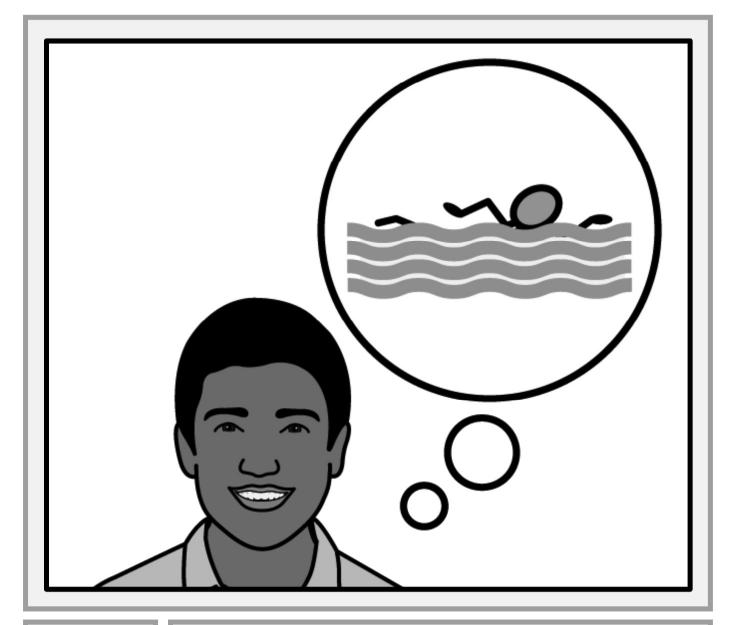

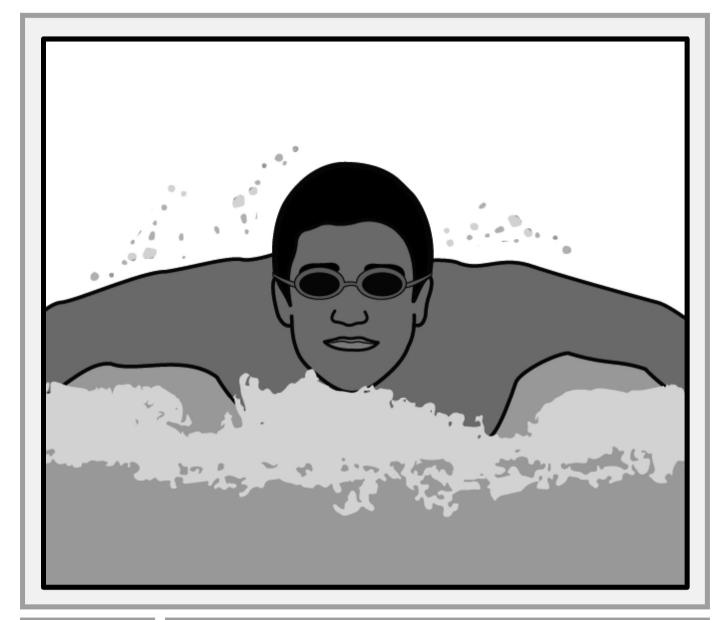


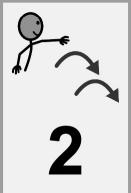

Micah works hard. He practices often.







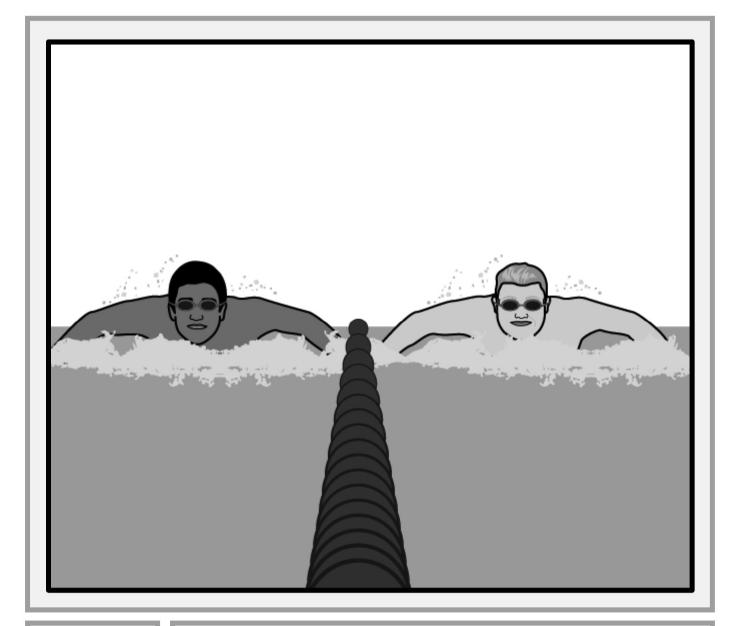

Patrick is Micah's good friend. He cares about Micah. He wants Micah to do his best.







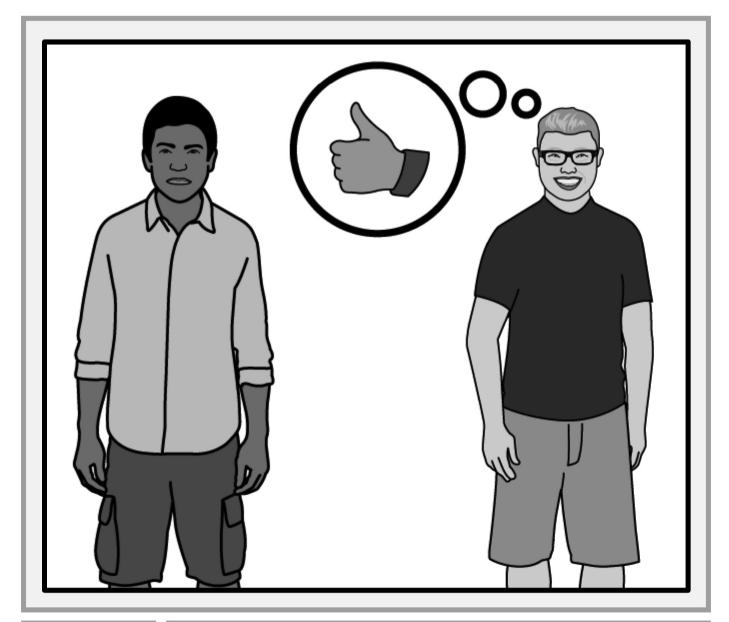

Sometimes Micah gets frustrated. Patrick reminds him of his goal. "You can do it," he tells Micah.







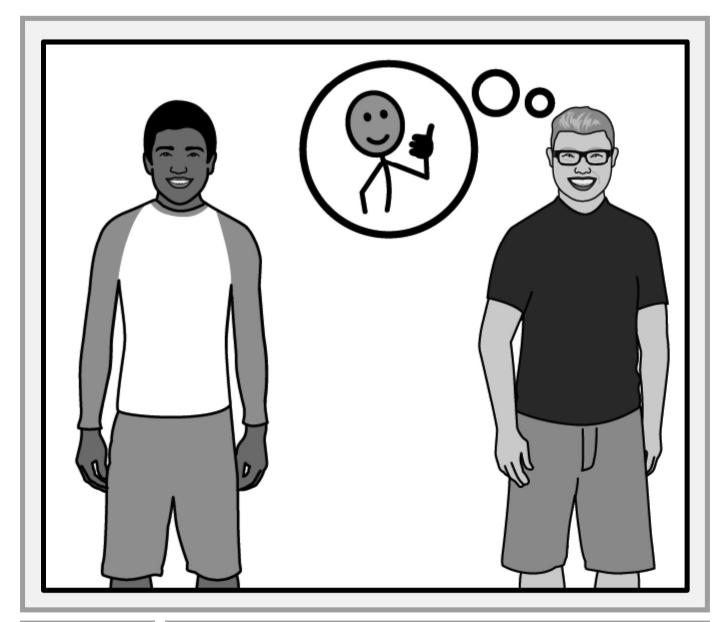

Patrick is there for Micah on race day. He brings a sign for Micah. He cheers for his friend. "Go, Micah! You can do it!"







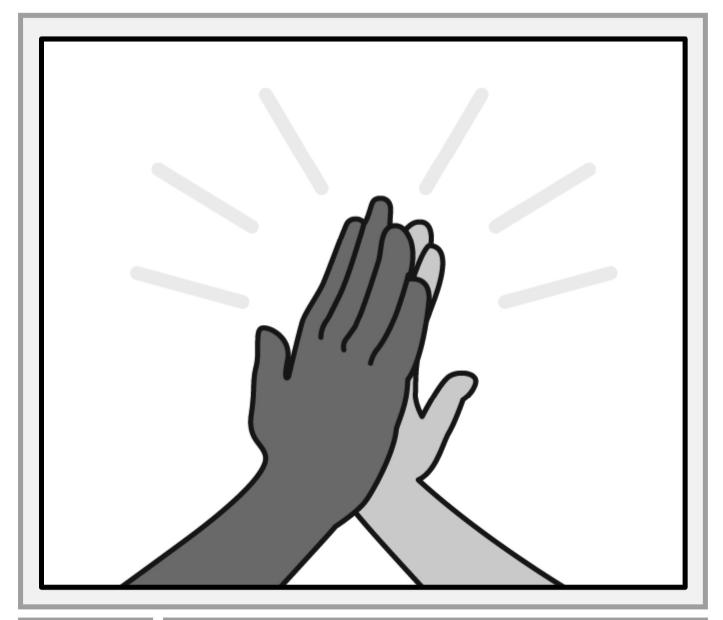

Micah swims fast. He finishes his swimming race and gets out of the water. Patrick is excited. "Way to go, Micah! You did it!" he says.





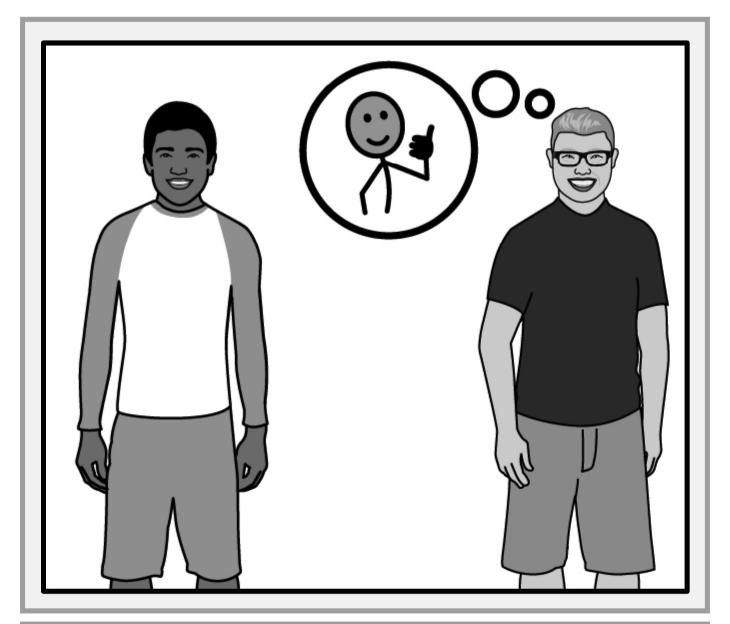

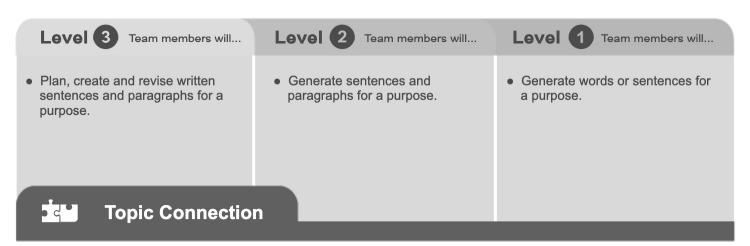

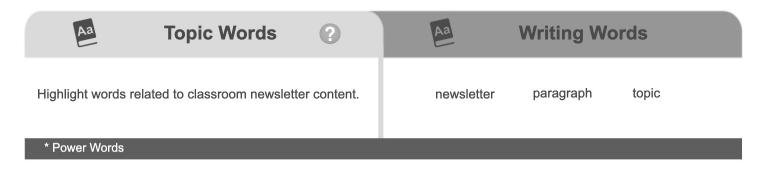
