

2. Put sand, salt and 1 ½ C flour into bowl. Mix together.



3. Put water into bowl 1/4 C at a time. Stir.




 Knead dough until all ingredients are combined forming a large ball. (Add 1 T flour at a time if dough is too sticky. Add 1 T water if dough is too dry.)


5. Divide large dough ball into 4 smaller balls.



6. Sprinkle flour onto work surface.



7. On floured surface, flatten each ball into a 1 - 2-cm thick circle.



8. Use straw to make hole at the top of each dough circle.

9. Press shells into dough circles.



10. Put dough circles onto baking sheet.



11. Bake for 4 hours. Let cool.







12. Measure and cut 4 (12-in) pieces of ribbon.




13. Thread one piece of ribbon through the hole in each ornament. Tie into bow.













