These Native Americans enforced tribal laws. Minor offenses were punished with whippings, but serious crimes ended in execution.

According to Plains Indian beliefs, this was the afterlife where the dead would meet their ancestors.

This was the Natives' term for whiskey. It was "moonshine" that was either diluted or flavored with tobacco, red pepper, or molasses.

4. _____

These were people who smuggled illegal liquor into Indian Territory. Their nickname comes from the location where the whiskey was hidden.

5. _____

Her real name was Myra Shirley, and she was tagged "The Bandit Queen" by the newspapers. Her homestead was a safe haven for criminals.

He was a famous bank robber who often hid out in Indian Territory, even though he did most of his "work" in Kansas and Missouri.

7. _____

This was a mounted group of local lawmen who pursued outlaws, but would not enter Indian Territory.

8. _____

He was a former lawyer and congressman who was appointed to head the Western District. He also had an unusual nickname: "The Hanging Judge."

This was how prisoners rode to the jail in Fort Smith. The marshals sometimes kept captured criminals locked in them for months.

He was one of the best deputies west of the Mississippi River. He was an ex-slave and a master of disguise.
