1. _____

This legislation, passed in 1887, dissolved tribal ownership of land and gave allotments to each individual Indian.

2. _____

This bill was originally intended to help Indian education, but after many revisions, actually abolished all remaining tribal rights.

3. _____

This was the name given to two million acres in the heart of Indian Territory. In the 1880s, pressure was mounting to open them to white settlement.

4. _____

He was the leader of the Boomer Movement, people who took part in the land "explosion" of the 1870s and 1880s.

5. _____

This legislative attachment to the annual Indian Appropriation Act opened the central territory. President Grover Cleveland signed it into law.

6. _____

This was someone who illegally settled in the unoccupied territory in order to own it. Patrolling troops removed hundreds of them.

7. _____

This was the nickname given to the Land Run. It was named for the new president who signed the proclamation.

8. _____

Early on April 22, 1889, hundreds of these covered wagons lined up along the South Canadian River, waiting for the starting signal.

9. _____

This was a community founded by Edward McCabe, the state auditor of Kansas. It is east of Guthrie.

10. _____

These were people who built their houses by plowing up the grass and stacking the strips for walls.
