1. \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_  
These were two men appointed as the state's first Senators. One was a blind attorney from Lawton; the other was a Cherokee attorney from Muskogee
2. \_\_\_\_\_  
He was the publisher of the Black Dispatch, and worked hard to end racial discrimination.
3. \_\_\_\_\_  
This wealthy Tulsa neighborhood had a thriving business district and was known as The Black Wall Street.
4. \_\_\_\_\_  
This group was active in politics and included union miners, farmers, and immigrants. They supported the creation of cooperatives, or co-ops.
5. \_\_\_\_\_  
He was the first African American state representative. He was from Guthrie and was a member of the Republican Party.
6. \_\_\_\_\_  
This law restricted voting rights to descendants of people eligible to vote on Jan. 1, 1866. It virtually denied the vote to African Americans.
7. \_\_\_\_\_  
She was the first woman in the nation elected to a state office, and pushed for the establishment of a state penitentiary in McAlester.
8. \_\_\_\_\_  
He was Oklahoma's second Governor, and appointed a commission to manage the construction of the State Capitol.
9. \_\_\_\_\_  
He was Oklahoma's third governor. Under his administration, the highway system was expanded and the Capitol Building was completed.
10. \_\_\_\_\_  
He was a member of the Sac and Fox tribe, and is considered by most sports writers to be the "Athlete of the Century."
