1. _____

This legislation authorized the draft, or mandatory enlistment for military service. More than 90,000 Oklahomans served.

2. _____

This was the Army's field artillery training base near Fort Sill. The two bases trained more than 60,000 soldiers.

3. _____

This was the name given to the United States' troops during World War I.

4. _____

This was the first name, nickname, and last name of the commander of the U.S. troops. He had led a troop of Buffalo Soldiers during the Plains Indian Wars.

5. _____

These Native Americans translated radio messages into their tribal language.

6. _____

This was the name for a protest demonstration by a group of Oklahomans. It takes its name from their limited food supply.

7. _____

These were crops planted by ordinary people which allowed commercial farms to send more fruits, herbs, and vegetables to the soldiers overseas.

8. _____

This was a name given to Oklahoma business owners who donated their time to work in civil service or as government officials.

9. _____

This was the name given to a worldwide outbreak of disease in 1918. It killed more than 7,000 Oklahomans.

10. _____

In 1924, this Congressional legislation granted full rights to all Native Americans.
