1. _____

This was a time of fear that international communism was taking over the U.S. labor movement. It caused Oklahomans to be suspicious of anything "anti-American."

2. _____

This was a white supremacist group that was active in Oklahoma. It was started after the Civil War and re-emerged during the 1920s.

3. _____

This event occurred on May 30-June 2, 1921, killed dozens of people, and left 35 blocks of the Greenwood neighborhood destroyed.

4. _____

These are substances made from oil by-products. Because Oklahoma was a leading oil producer, a production plant for them was opened in Osage County.

5. _____

This was a new company started by two brothers in Oklahoma City who borrowed \$11,000 to buy a plane.

6. _____

He was a famous aviator who set speed and time records. He also designed a pressure suit that allowed pilots to fly at extremely high altitudes.

7. _____

This was one of the first restaurant chains in the U.S. Its dining hall in Waynoka became a national celebrity hot-spot.

8. _____

This highway is known as "The Main Street of America" and was championed by Oklahoman Cyrus Avery.

9. _____

This was a former dry goods store in Guthrie that became a Vaudeville variety house. It was also later remodeled to show movies.

10. _____

He was an Oklahoma performer who appeared in Wild West Shows and on stage. Later, he wrote for newspapers and did radio shows, making particular fun of politicians.
