1. \_\_\_\_\_

On December 7, 1941, Japanese planes attacked the U.S. Naval Base in this Hawaiian port. One of the casualties was the U.S.S. Oklahoma, losing 429 men.

2. \_\_\_\_\_

In 1948, Midwest Air Depot's name was changed to honor of the first Native American army general. He was killed in action during WWII.

3. \_\_\_\_\_

This was the nickname of the 45th Infantry Division of the National Guard. They saw heavy fighting in Europe, and lost more than 20,000 men in World War II.

4. \_\_\_\_\_

He was a soldier serving with the 45th Infantry who would win a Pulitzer Prize for his wartime cartoons of two G.I.s named "Willie and Joe."

5. \_\_\_\_\_

This was the nickname of the 90th Infantry, a Texas-Oklahoma unit formed during World War I. They fought several battles in Europe.

6. \_\_\_\_\_

For security reasons, many Japanese-Americans were sent to these facilities in Fort Sill, McAlester, and Stringtown.

7. \_\_\_\_\_

This character was the personification of the American women who began working in factories after men left their jobs and went to war.

8. \_\_\_\_\_

People on the homefront used this system to purchase limited supplies of food, clothing, petroleum, and other items.

9. \_\_\_\_\_

This was an effort by schools to collect old metal that could be recycled to make planes and battleships.

10. \_\_\_\_\_

This was the play by Claremore native Lynn Riggs that was made into the musical "Oklahoma!" Its title number became our state song in 1955.
