1. _____

These new communities developed on the edges of existing cities. Locally, towns like Bethany, Warr Acres, Nichols Hills, The Village, Midwest City, and Del City were expanded.

This was the joining of rural schools that occurred after the war. State districts fell from more than 6,000 to just over 500.

This was Oklahoma's first television station, and it began broadcasting in black-and-white in 1949.

This was the full, formal name of the nation's first public television network. Today, KETA Channel 13 broadcasts with 17 other stations statewide.

This was the first radio station to switch to a rock-and-roll format in the 1950s. It could be heard all over the southwestern United States.

7. _____

This museum, which celebrated our state's western heritage, was established in 1955.

8. _____

In 1956, President Dwight Eisenhower championed this nationwide network of roads.

Due to the popularity of automobiles, a Shawnee café changed its format and took on this new, space-age name.

This was the most popular amusement park in Oklahoma in the 1950s. It featured an Old West theme.
