1. \_\_\_\_\_

He was the youngest man ever elected governor of Oklahoma, at age 33. He was part of the "Youth Movement" that swept the U.S. in the late 50s and early 60s.

2. \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_

These were Oklahoma's first two Republican governors. Both went on to serve as U.S. Senators, and one served a second term as Governor in the 1980s.

3. \_\_\_\_\_

He was the judge who ordered Oklahoma City's schools to be integrated by forced busing of Black students to predominantly white schools.

4. \_\_\_\_\_

This was the name for the movement of families to the suburbs to avoid the desegregation of inner city schools.

5. \_\_\_\_\_

He was the first African American football player for the University of Oklahoma. He later played in the NFL and earned a PhD.

6. \_\_\_\_\_

This is the nickname for Oklahoma City's Asian District. Thousands of Vietnamese immigrants moved to our state following the war.

7. \_\_\_\_\_

The passage of this legislation allowed 18- to 20-year-olds to vote in presidential elections. More than 50% of eligible voters did so.

8. \_\_\_\_\_

She was the first female mayor of a major metropolitan area when she was elected in 1971. She served 12 years.

9. \_\_\_\_\_

He was a Ponca Indian who emerged as a national leader in Native American issues in the mid-1960s.

10. \_\_\_\_\_

She was part Comanche and founded the intertribal organization Oklahomans for Indian Opportunity in 1970.
