1. \_\_\_\_\_

As a young man from Kingfisher, he got into the variety store business. He later opened his own company, which is now worth more than \$250 billion.

This was Oklahoma's first mall. In the 1960s and 70s, shopping patterns moved from downtown stores to suburban centers.

3. \_\_\_\_\_

From this area near Tulsa, barges can reach the Mississippi River and New Orleans by way of the McClellan-Kerr/Arkansas River Navigation System.

4. \_\_\_\_\_

This 40-square-mile Superfund Cleanup Site in Ottawa County is one of the most contaminated sites in the U.S.

He was elected governor in 1975, campaigning on "cleaning up government." His supporters were known as the "Broom Brigade."

6. \_\_\_\_\_

This is the deepest well in the United States, at nearly 6 miles depth. It was part of the oil boom of the mid-1970s.

This was an organization trying to ensure a constant standard of living for Oklahoma farm workers.

She was an Oklahoma astronaut from Bethany and spent a record 188 days in space in 1996.

She wrote the novel The Outsiders about her Tulsa high school. She tried to create sympathy for the "Greasers" by writing from their point of view.

He was the Emmy Award-winning Oklahoma actor who starred for six seasons in "The Rockford Files."
