1. _____
He was the first governor to be elected to two consecutive terms, and the first to win all 77 state counties.
2. _____
A native of Duncan, she served as the U.S. ambassador to the United Nations under President Ronald Reagan.
3. _____
He was the Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff under two presidents, the highest ranking military officer in the country.
4. _____
This was an FBI investigation into corruption in our state. The probe was started by State Auditor and Inspector Tom Daxon.
5. _____
These were illegal payments from profits made on overpriced merchandise and services. 69 state employees, as well as contractors and suppliers, were convicted of taking them.
6. _____
This financial crisis resulted in losses of more than \$500 million and the closing of more than 50 financial institutions in Oklahoma by 1990.
7. _____
Oklahoma legalized this form of gambling in 1982 to stimulate the faltering economy by generating revenue from horse racing.
8. _____
This racetrack opened in 1988 and added a casino in 2005. It is the oldest horse racing venue in the state; the first, Blue Ribbon Downs, closed in 2010.

This federal project helped rural communities like Duncan, which were suffering from hard times, revitalize their historic downtown areas.

This was the name of Oklahoma's 75th birthday celebration in 1982. It included a surprise appearance by President Theodore Roosevelt.
