6 This financial crisis resulted in losses of more than \$500 million and the closing of more than 50 financial institutions in Oklahoma by 1990.

Oklahoma legalized this form of gambling in 1982 to stimulate the faltering economy by generating revenue from horse racing.

8 This racetrack opened in 1988 and added a casino in 2005. It is the oldest horse racing venue in the state; the first, Blue Ribbon Downs, closed in 2010.

10 This was the name of Oklahoma's 75th birthday celebration in 1982. It included a surprise appearance by President Theodore Roosevelt.
