1. _____

These Europeans were the first to set foot in North America, around 1000 A.D. They were originally from Scandinavia.

2. _____

This was the name of the European settlement in Canada. Its purpose was to grow grapes for making wine.

3. _____

This is an unusual carving discovered in Indian Territory. It is either the date "November 11, 1012 A.D.," or a phrase meaning "Gloomy Valley."

4. _____

This was the name given to the Spanish warriors who defeated the Native Americans and took control of their lands and resources.

5. _____

Reports of these communities with buildings made of gold led to Spanish expeditions across the American southwest.

6. _____

This Spanish commander led a two-year expedition to Quivira. It turned out to be a simple Wichita Indian village.

7. _____

Father Juan de Padilla went back to Quivira as one. This refers to a person who is sent on a journey to preach Christianity.

8. _____

The land surrounding the Mississippi River was called by this name. It had been claimed by La Salle and was named for the king of France.

9. _____

He was the first French explorer to enter Oklahoma. He established a trading post on the Red River and wrote that he was impressed with the land and its people.

This was the first permanent English settlement in North America. The settlers arrived on May 14, 1607.
