1. \_\_\_\_\_  
This was a conflict fought primarily in the Ohio River Valley. It was known as The Seven Years' War in Europe.
2. \_\_\_\_\_  
This was an alliance of six native tribes whose homelands were surrounded by the colony of New York. They supported the British.
3. \_\_\_\_\_  
He was the leader of the Ottawa tribe, and led a rebellion against the new British forts and settlements around the Great Lakes.
4. \_\_\_\_\_  
This is a term for trespass (or intrusion without permission) on tribal lands. In 1763, the British promised not to disturb Indian hunting grounds west of the southern colonies.
5. \_\_\_\_\_  
These were pioneers who crossed the Appalachians to track wild game for food. Their leader was Daniel Boone.
6. \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_  
On April 19, 1775, the Revolutionary War started when the British fired on colonists at these two locations.
7. \_\_\_\_\_  
This document established a new homeland for the Cherokee tribe in 1785, but failed to stop the advance of American settlers.
8. \_\_\_\_\_  
This was the desire to own all the land from the Atlantic to the Pacific and to spread America's beliefs and idealism from coast to coast.
9. \_\_\_\_\_  
Under the terms of this agreement in 1795, Spain had to cede the lands it had been given less than 10 years earlier.
10. \_\_\_\_\_  
In 1788, traders established this new trade route from Santa Fe, New Mexico, through southern Oklahoma, and ending in Natchitoches, Louisiana.
