This journey was commissioned to survey the Red River. It turned back when it was confronted by a large Spanish army.

This young officer broke off from Zebulon Pike's expedition to explore the Arkansas River. His journal provided a detailed account of life in early Oklahoma.

He was the first American civilian to enter Oklahoma. He had traded with the Wichita Indians at the Twin Villages.

George Sibley discovered this area in northwest Oklahoma after a lengthy search through Nebraska and Kansas.
5. _____
This Army officer surveyed two different areas of Oklahoma: the Poteau River and, accidentally, the South Canadian River.

This line made Indian Territory the gateway to the Great American Desert.
7. _____
This document settled the boundary between Spanish and U.S. lands. In addition, Spain agreed to sell Florida for \$5 million.

This is the area in eastern Oklahoma where the Arkansas River, the Verdigris River, and the Grand River meet.

This business was established in 1821 by Colonel A.P. Chouteau. Within 10 years, its primary focus switched from furs to salt, pecans, and grains.

This popular variation of the Santa Fe Trail crossed the Oklahoma Panhandle. It got its name because it trimmed 10 days off travel time.
