1. _____
This word means suffering from extreme poverty. Most of the Native American tribes lost everything when they moved west.
2. _____
Under this agreement, the Choctaw ceded all their Mississippi lands and moved to lands in southeastern Indian Territory.
3. _____
These are the privileges believed to belong to all people. The new Choctaw Constitution contained wording that safeguarded them.
4. _____
This is the ability to read and write. The Wheelock Academy was established to provide an advanced education to the Choctaw, not just simple skills.
5. _____
This was the Choctaw police force. These native lawmen worked out of the Choctaw's new capital, Fort Towson.
6. _____
This is the term for a yearly rental payment. The Chickasaw were required to pay it because they lived on Choctaw lands.
7. _____
This was one of the first Chickasaw towns. It took its name from the swamp-like environment surrounding it.
8. _____
This was the name of a postal service between Memphis, Tennessee, and San Francisco, California. It made an important stop in Chickasaw territory.
9. _____
This town was selected in 1840 as the tribal capital of the Cherokee Nation. The first newspaper in Indian Territory, the Cherokee Advocate, was published there in 1844.
10. _____
This was an area in southwestern Oklahoma where other, smaller tribes were later relocated.
