1. _____

These are people who move to a new country to settle there. American democracy was a welcome change from the repressive governments of their home countries.

2. _____

This is a downturn in the economy. Two of them, in 1818 and 1839, caused people to leave eastern states and seek land out west.

3. _____

He was the leader of the expansion movement in the United States.

4. _____

This is the taking-over of an existing territory or country. The United States did this to Texas in 1845.

5. _____

This is the name given to lands acquired by the U.S. following the 1846-48 war. It included all or parts of what would become seven states.

6. _____

This area, from the Adams-Onis Treaty Line to 54° 40', was claimed both by the U.S. and Great Britain. It was later divided along the 49th Parallel.

7. _____

The southwestern border of the United States was settled by this transaction in 1853. The U.S. now controlled all land between the Atlantic and Pacific.

8. _____

This was a 65-foot-tall stone in the Canadian River. It was described by explorer Benjamin Bonneville.

9. _____

This two-volume book by Dr. Josiah Gregg described the eastern half of Indian Territory as "an unbroken succession of grassy plains and fertile glades."

10. _____ and _____

These two military officers led an expedition that also explored Indian Territory, reporting on its natural resources.
