4 This is the taking-over of an existing territory or country. The United States did this to Texas in 1845.

This is the name given to lands acquired by the U.S. following the 1846-48 war. It included all or parts of what would become seven states.

This area, from the Adams-Onis Treaty Line to 54°40', was claimed both by the U.S. and Great Britain. It was later divided along the 49th Parallel.

7 The southwestern border of the United States was settled by this transaction in 1853. The U.S. now controlled all land between the Atlantic and Pacific.

8 This was a 65-foot-tall stone in the Canadian River. It was described by explorer Benjamin Bonneville.

This two-volume book by Dr. Josiah Gregg described the eastern half of Indian Territory as "an unbroken succession of grassy plains and fertile glades."
