1. _____ and _____

Small bands of renegade warriors from these two tribes were encouraged by the success of the Comanches, and tried to drive settlers out of Colorado.

2. _____

This event took place when the Colorado Cavalry attacked an unprotected camp, killing more than 150 women and children.

3. _____

These are lands that have been set aside for Native Americans. Chief Black Kettle and his tribe were confined to one on the border of Texas and Indian Territory.

4. _____

This military post on the Cimarron Cutoff was supposed to be built in New Mexico, but ended up in Indian Territory.

5. _____

He was the Civil War veteran who led the Winter Campaign to defeat the Plains tribes.

6. _____

He was a young war chief who had left his camp with renegade warriors and began killing Kansas settlers.

7. _____

This young officer was sent to find the renegades responsible for the Kansas attacks. His 7th Cavalry and attacked a peaceful camp in western Oklahoma.

8. _____

In this event, the 7th Cavalry attacked Black Kettle's camp in Oklahoma and killed more than 100 men, women, and children, including the Chief.

These were black troops of the 10th Cavalry. They would build Fort Sill in the Comanche homeland.

He was a Comanche Chief who attacked several American settlements during the Red River War.
