

- a) What were the pluses and minuses of President James K. Polk's pro-expansion movement? (First, list <u>all</u> three major land additions during the Polk Administration [1845-1848], including a list of states created. Then, explain the consequences regarding Mexico and Great Britain.)
- b) Contrast the various routes taken to get to California during the Gold Rush. (*Contrast* [don't just list] the six routes to California. Do not include the Transcontinental Railroad.)
- c) Explain why the Transcontinental Railroad didn't go through Indian Territory as planned. (Detail <u>both</u> routes of the Transcontinental Railroad and the <u>specific</u> reason why one was chosen over the other [don't just use "Civil War politics.])
