

## **MAKE YOUR OWN PAINTED GLASS**

It's easy to make your own beautiful painted glass picture. Here's what you will need:

- A picture frame
- White glue
- · Glass paint and brushes
- Coloring book page or drawing
- Tape or a hot-glue gun


Here is what you'll need to do:

- **1.** Draw a picture, or if you'd prefer, choose a picture from a coloring book.
- **2.** Remove the back of the picture frame.
- **3.** Using tape or a hot-glue gun, secure the glass in the frame from the back.
- **4.** Place the frame facedown over your picture.
- 5. Using the glass paints and brushes, color in your picture.
- **6.** Squeeze out  $\frac{1}{3}$  of the glue and replace it with black paint. Mix them together.
- Using the original glue container, squeeze paint and glue mixture to line your picture to give it a stained-glass effect.
- **8.** Let your picture dry.
- **9.** Then, replace the back and hang your picture on the wall or attach strings to hang it in a window without the backing.


